CERTAIN POLYESTER STAPLE FIBER FROM CHINA

DETERMINATION

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year review, the United States International Trade Commission (Commission) determines, pursuant to section 751(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)), that revocation of the antidumping duty order on certain polyester staple fiber from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.²

BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted this review on May 1, 2012 (77 F.R. 25744) and determined on August 6, 2012 that it would conduct an expedited review (77 F.R. 50530, August 21, 2012).

The Commission transmitted its determination in this review to the Secretary of Commerce on September 28, 2012. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 4351 (September 2012), entitled *Certain Polyester Staple Fiber from China: Investigation No. 731-TA-1104 (Review)*.
