**ACTION:** Notice, correction.

**SUMMARY:** On August 7, 2013, notice was published on page 48216 of the **Federal Register** (volume 78, number 152) of the determinations made by the Department of State pertaining to the exhibition “Heaven and Earth: Art of Byzantium from Greek Collections.” The referenced notice is corrected here to include an additional object for the exhibition. Notice is hereby given of the following determinations:

Pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Act of October 19, 1965 (79 Stat. 985; 22 U.S.C. 2459), Executive Order 12047 of March 27, 1978, the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act of 1998 (112 Stat. 2681, et seq.; 22 U.S.C. 6501 note, et seq.), Delegation of Authority No. 234 of October 1, 1999, and Delegation of Authority No. 236-3 of August 28, 2000, I hereby determine that the additional object to be included in the exhibition **“Heaven and Earth: Art of Byzantium from Greek Collections,”** imported from abroad for temporary exhibition within the United States, is of cultural significance. I also determine that the exhibition or display of the additional object at the **Art Institute of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois**, from on or about **September 27, 2014**, until

on or about **February 15, 2015**, is in the national interest. I have ordered that Public Notice of these Determinations be published in the **Federal Register**.
