Notice of Determinations

Culturally Significant Objects Imported for Exhibition – Determinations: “The Allure of Matter: Material Art of China” Exhibition

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given of the following determinations: I hereby determine that certain objects to be included in the exhibition “**The Allure of Matter: Material Art of China,**” imported from abroad for temporary exhibition within the United States, are of cultural significance. The objects are imported pursuant to loan agreements with the foreign owners or custodians. I also determine that the exhibition or display of the exhibit objects at the **Los Angeles County Museum of Art**, Los Angeles, California, from on or about June 6, 2019, until on or about January 5, 2020, at the **David and Alfred Smart Museum of Art** and the **Wrightwood 659 Gallery**, both in Chicago, Illinois, from on or about February 4, 2020, until on or about May 3, 2020, at the **Seattle Art Museum**, Seattle, Washington, from on or about June 25, 2020, until on or about September 13, 2020, at the **Peabody Essex Museum**, Salem, Massachusetts, from on or about November 14, 2020, until on or about February 21, 2021, and at possible additional exhibitions or venues yet to be determined, is in the national interest. I have ordered that Public Notice of these determinations be published in the *Federal Register*.
