### **Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement for the Oil and Gas Leasing Decisions in Seven States from February 2015 to December 2020; Rescission**

**AGENCY:** Bureau of Land Management, Interior.

**ACTION:** Notice of rescission.

**SUMMARY:** The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is rescinding its notice to prepare an environmental impact statement (EIS) for the oil and gas leasing decisions in seven States from February 2015 to December 2020. The BLM announced its intent to prepare the EIS in a notice that published in the *Federal Register* on January 16, 2025.
