Request for Comments on the Renewal of a Previously Approved Information Collection:

Application for Conveyance of Port Facility Property

AGENCY: Maritime Administration (MARAD), U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT)

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: MARAD invites public comments on its intention to request approval from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to renew an information collection in accordance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995. The proposed information collection 2133-0524 (Application for Conveyance of Port Facility Property) is used to determine if an applicant is committed to a port redevelopment plan, the plan is in the best interests of the public, and the property for development will be used in accordance with the terms of port conveyance and applicable statutes and regulations. MARAD is required to publish this notice in the *Federal Register* to obtain comments from the public and affected agencies.

Type of Request: Extension without change of a previously approved information collection.

Abstract: Public Law 103–160, as applied by 40 U.S.C. 554, authorizes the Department of Transportation to convey to public entities surplus Federal property needed for the development or operation of a port Facility. This information collection allows MARAD to approve the conveyance of property and administer the port facility conveyance program.
