- Evaluate the accuracy of the agency's estimate of the burden of the proposed collection of information, including the validity of the methodology and assumptions used;
- Evaluate whether and if so how the quality, utility, and clarity of the information to be collected can be enhanced; and
- Minimize the burden of the collection of information on those who are to respond, including through the use of appropriate automated, electronic, mechanical, or other technological collection techniques or other forms of information technology, e.g., permitting electronic submission of responses.

Abstract: This form is used by those persons making a claim against the United States Government under the Federal Tort Claims Act.
- 5 Obligation to Respond: Voluntary but required to obtain a benefit.
- 6 Total Estimated Number of Respondents: It is estimated that there will be 100,000 respondents.
- 7 Estimated Time per Respondent: 6 hours to respond

8 Frequency: Once

9 Total Estimated Annual Time Burden – The total estimated annual burden hours to complete the certification form is 600,000 hours.
