



## INTERNATIONAL TRADE COMMISSION

### [Investigation Nos. 701-TA-451 and 731-TA-1126 (Third Review)]

#### Lightweight Thermal Paper from China; Determinations

On the basis of the record<sup>1</sup> developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the countervailing and antidumping duty orders on lightweight thermal paper from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

#### BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted these reviews on June 2, 2025 (90 FR 23370, June 2, 2025) and determined on September 5, 2025 that it would conduct expedited reviews (90 FR 45809, September 23, 2025).<sup>2</sup>

The Commission made these determinations pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determinations in these reviews on January 6, 2026. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 5967 (January 2026), entitled *Lightweight Thermal Paper from China: Investigation Nos. 701-TA-451 and 731-TA-1126 (Third Review)*.
