**A. Overview of Information Collection**

**Title of Information Collection:** Public Housing Capital Fund Amendments to the Annual Contributions Contract.

**OMB Approval Number:** 2577-0303.

**Type of Request:** Extension of a currently approved collection.

**Form Number:** HUD-52840A.

**Description of the need for the information and proposed use:** Public Housing Agencies (PHAs) are required to submit information to HUD in connection with their grantee duties to operate and maintain/modernize public housing dwelling units and other real property under the United States Housing Act of 1937 (1937 Act) (42 U.S.C. 1437, et seq.). Section 9 of the 1937 Act permits the Secretary of HUD to make grants (i.e., annual contributions) to PHAs to achieve and maintain the low-income character of public housing projects. The Secretary is required to embody the provisions for such annual contributions in an agreement (i.e., the ACC). Applicable regulations are 24 CFR part 905 for Public Housing Capital Fund Program.
