Non-Oriented Electrical Steel from China, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Sweden, and Taiwan;

Determinations

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the countervailing duty orders on non-oriented electrical steel (“NOES”) from China and Taiwan and revocation of the antidumping duty orders on NOES from China, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Sweden, and Taiwan would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted these reviews on November 3, 2025 (90 FR 55159, December 1, 2025) and determined on March 6, 2026 that it would conduct expedited reviews (91 FR 17306, April 6, 2026).

The Commission made these determinations pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determinations in these reviews on May 8, 2026. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 5736 (May 2026), entitled *Non-Oriented Electrical Steel from China, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Sweden, and Taiwan: Investigation Nos. 701-TA-506 and 508 and 731-TA-1238-1243 (Second Review)*.
