Crepe Paper from China; Determination

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year review, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the antidumping duty order on crepe paper from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

Background

The Commission instituted this review on February 2, 2026 (91 FR 4611) and determined on May 8, 2026 that it would conduct an expedited review (91 FR 34648, June 8, 2026).

The Commission made this determination pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determination in this review on July 10, 2026. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 5763 (July 2026), entitled *Crepe Paper from China: Investigation No. 731-TA-1070A (Fourth Review)*.
